Dr Ashwini Chhattre is currently working as Senior Research Fellow and Visiting Professor, Economics and Public Policy in Indian School of Business, Hyderabad. He is working as Director of Research, Revitalizing Rainfed Agriculture Network, India. Ashwini Chhatre is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Geography at University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, with research interests broadly centered on the dynamic cross-scale interactions between democratization, economic development, and environmental governance. Ashwini was the Giorgio Ruffolo Post-doctoral Fellow in Sustainability Science, Harvard University in 2007.

Ashwini has a Ph.D. in Political Science from Duke University and spent 11 years working with local communities and social movements on democratic governance of natural resources in India. He has done Masters in Political Science (Comparative Politics and Political Methodology) from Duke University in 2004. He has an undergraduate degree in Economics from the University of Delhi.

He has published many books and journals mainly on Politics, Conservation, and Development in India. Ashwini has co-authored one book and published articles in Science, PNAS, Conservation Biology, World Development, and other journals. His research investigates the intersections of democracy with environment and development, with a more recent focus on rural livelihood dynamics in rainfed systems across different agro-ecological and socio-political contexts. His ongoing research projects are in the field of agriculture, carbon sequestration, and biodiversity conservation.
